What are Crimes?

In every state, crimes are categorized. Typically, the categories include felonies (most serious) to infractions (least serious). Misdemeanors fall in between on that spectrum. Decisions on which crime meets the criteria for these classifications are made by the state pursuant to the applicable statutes.

I Have a Misdemeanor, Now What?

Misdemeanors can place you in jail for up to one year! Possession of a Controlled Substance in Idaho, possession of paraphernalia and minor in possession of alcohol or other drug/alcohol misdemeanors are the most frequent in Idaho.

Usually, when charged with a misdemeanor you are released and not taken to jail. But you will be given a court appearance date, which is called an arraignment. Don't make the mistake of thinking that, because you were not taken to jail, you have only been given a ticket. Missing a court date or getting a second misdemeanor before your arraignment can lead to serious legal ramifications.

I Have a Felony, Now What?

Felonies are serious offenses which can place you in jail for over one year. If you find
